The ceremony was a very moving event and our school student representatives did themselves, their families and our school proud - well done to everyone who attended.

Six LGPS students were in the Combined Schools Choir. They have been practicing as a group over the last few weeks. This involved giving up their own time and parents having to take them to and from practice sessions. Their performance of 3 items including Australian and New Zealand National Anthems was lovely and we are very proud of your commitment to this project.
