## Talented and Gift Program for High School comes to Albany

This week it was announced that a face to face Gifted and Talented program for

students with exceptional academic ability will commence at Albany Senior High School from 2022.....

Students entering Year 7 in 2022 can apply for a place in the new program when applications for Gifted and Talented secondary selective entrance programs open later this year.

The first intake will see up to 32 selected Year 7 students join the program in 2022 before it expands to other year groups.

Students who live outside of Albany in the Great Southern can apply and will be able to board at Albany Residential College.

This is exciting news especially for the students who currently attend our PEAC program, as this gives them more options and pathways into secondary education. It also means rural students who are Gifted and Talented will have more options to continue their education in Albany, rather than going to Perth for a similar program or having to do this type of program online.

It will be intended that there is a strong link between the PEAC program in our school and this new program at Albany Senior High School. Currently we have 65 students (Year 5 and 6 students) attend our PEAC program from around the Great Southern region, under the expert tuition of Mrs Margriet Walker. A significant number of these students attend Little Grove Primary School. The testing for placement in our PEAC program for 2021 will be held later in the year for all year 4 students.

This focus has inspired many in Room 7, 8 and 6 to skip during breaks!

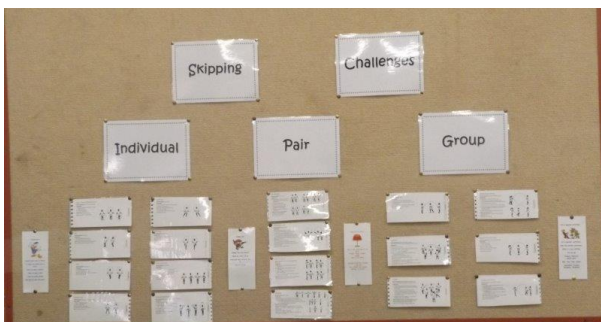
According to the students, many are enjoying this section of the curriculum.
