And so, continuing on in our series "The Strengths of Nature" we're going to look at the "Walrus" and see what this strange and interesting animal can teach us about chilling out.

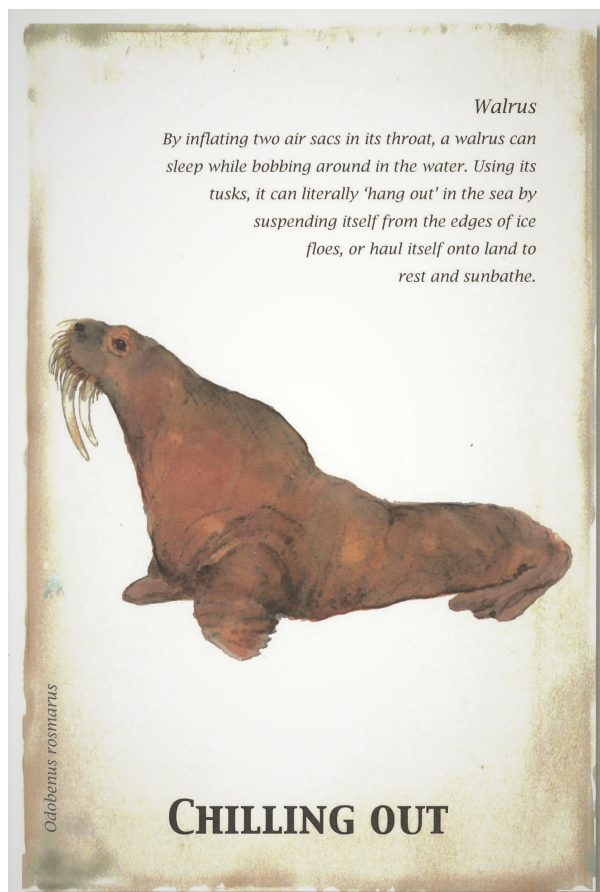
