Before school care

On Wednesday 4 September our Choir went to the Music Festival at the Albany Entertainment Centre (AEC) to perform in the Albany Primary Schools' Music Festival. The festival is a showcase night for the schools in the Albany area to show what they are doing in their music classes.

In previous years we have had a very full program with around 9-11 schools performing, which means a huge number of students are involved, making it very difficult to get tickets, sometimes selling out in an hour! This year we trialled splitting the schools and having the performances over two nights; on Wednesday Australian Christian College, Bethel Christian School, Little Grove PS, Mount Lockyer PS and St Joseph's College performed.
