Joanna:

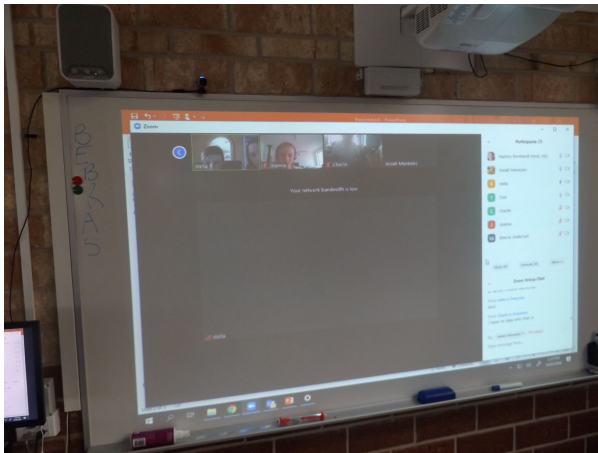
The Zoom lesson was fun and interesting with many laughs and questions. I think we can work on staying to a specific topic. ex: Powerpoint

We can meet at school again which is great but there are many new rules and regulations to get our heads around which can be confusing and daunting.

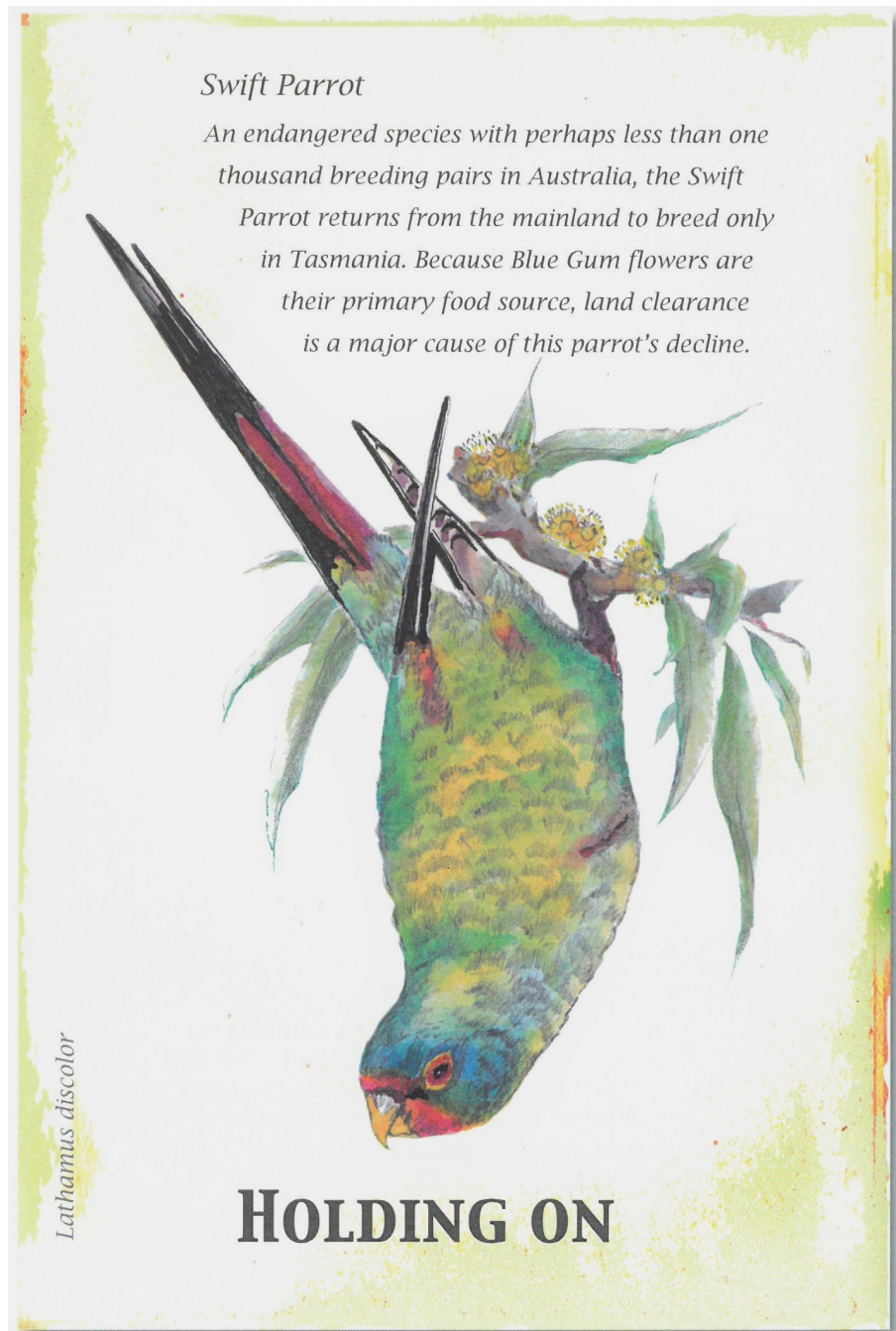
And so, continuing on in my new series "The Strengths of Nature" we're going to look at the "Swift Parrot" and see what this bird can teach us about holding on.
